The original Urban Planning and the legal development in the current status: a similarity among the word's and Brazilian laws.

### **ABSTRACT**

The town planning was born under the control logic of the excesses and ills of technological cities, leading to the creation, in Brazil and in the world, laws to be used in corrective nature rather than preventive, since epochs past. Considering the effects of technocentrism caused urbanism during and after the industrial revolution, this work aimed to evaluate the rules of urban planning in Brazil and around the world by checking the similarity between them. To this end it carried out a systematic review, with active search for articles by keyword in English and filters on platform search. It could be observed that, both in Brazil and in the countries assessed, the Urban Planning was divided into corrective nature rather than preventive, demonstrating the need of using the law on executive nature and not punitive.

### INTRODUCTION

The town planning was born under the logic of the control of excesses and ills of technological cities. The last and fundamental change was generated by a complexity of events to which it called " industrial revolution ". Even with increasing raw materials production possibilities in the farms, the most promising opportunities for the development of industries has brought many families of the agricultural districts to urban districts. Born of new disorderly manner and many cities have grown beyond measure.

With this conflict, there are two sciences necessary restructuring of the order and the division of cities, planning and zoning, which have become repair tools urban disorder and legal instruments to regulate contemporary and new situations. Considering the effects of technocentrism's on urbanism during and after the industrial revolution, this study aimed to perform a systematic review about the Urban Planning origin in the world and how it has evolved based on the legislation applied to those cities changed throughout history, relative similarity to the Brazilian legislation.

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### MATERIAL AND METHODS

This article was accomplished through a systematic review, a form of research that uses as literature data source on a particular theme and provides a summary of evidence related to an intervention strategy by applying explicit methods and search systematized, evaluation, appreciation review and synthesis of the selected information. It allows you to incorporate a wider range of relevant results, instead of limiting the conclusions to read only a few articles (Sampaio & Mancini, 2007). For systematic review, keywords have been selected in English, in order to carry out active search for topics on a specific platform. Selected terms were "*Urban Plan of USA*", "*Urban Plan USA Law*", "*Urban Plan of London*", "*Urban Plan London Law*", "*Urban Plan of France*", "*Urban Plan French Law*", "*Urban Plan of Germany*", "*Urban Plan Germany Law*". The platforms used for the search were Google (Avaliable in <www.Google.com.br>) and Academic Google (<a href="https://scholar.google.com.br/">https://scholar.google.com.br/>).

### **RESULTS AND DISCUSSION**

From the filters used in the systematic review it was possible to develop the following Table 01, with the results of active search for articles.

It was possible to state that, both in Brazil and in the countries assessed, the Urban Planning was divided into corrective nature rather than preventive, demonstrating the need of using the law on executive nature and not punitive.

#### FINAL CONSIDERATIONS

The modern urbanism arose not simultaneously technical and economic processes that have given rise and led to the transformation of the industrial city. It formed later when the quantitative effects of ongoing changes have become evident and came into conflict with each other a restorative intervention becoming inevitable. Today the urban technique takes corrective nature rather than preventive, and the legal basis for such a regulatory tool.

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
